Top Reasons to Register at a Parish

- A sense of belonging and identity in a parish community.
- It is a commitment to practice your faith.
- It enables the parish pastor and staff to get to know you better, to welcome you and to minister to you.
- It helps you stay connected with your parish and helps your parish stay connected with you. Once you are registered, please notify the parish office of any changes in address or phone number.
- Registered active members are eligible for sponsor/godparent validation.
- What about Children who are 18 Years of Age or Older? Once they are 18, it is their responsibility to join a church family, participate in the Mass and to register as a member independent of their parents.

EASTERTIDE:

The 50 days of Easter

For most people, Easter is only one weekend in the year that begins with Good Friday and ends with Resurrection Sunday. Unfortunately, what many do not understand (even some Catholics) is that Easter is not just one day or one weekend, it is a whole season. In fact, Eastertide, or Paschal Time as it is also known, lasts a full 50 days, from



Resurrection Sunday until Pentecost Sunday. This makes it the longest liturgical season in the liturgical year, longer than both Christmas and Lent.

Why is this not common knowledge?

Part of the reason is that Easter does not have the same commercial appeal that Christmas has. However, we should consider the Easter season as an invitation to explore and celebrate our relationship with God and His presence in the world more deeply. To reflect on what a crucial period of time this was for the early days of the church, which defined early Christianity's existence.


The Tradition behind Eastertide

In Christianity, the 50 days which pass between Easter Sunday and the Pentecost are symbolic of the days that passed between Christ's resurrection and the Pentecost, which commemorates the day of the coming of the Holy Spirit on the early followers of Christ. This moment was instrumental in cementing Christianity's place in history. It should also be noted that the Easter season corresponds to pre-existing Jewish feasts: The first day of Pesach and the holiday of Shavuot. In the Jewish tradition, the 49 days between these holidays are known as the Counting of the Omer.

What can I do to connect more closely with God during this time?

Nowadays, Eastertide is a time for celebration, including prayer and jubilation. Attending church throughout this time is important. The Church reflects more deeply on this period through reading the Acts of the Apostles at all Masses throughout Eastertide. These readings tell the story of the church's earliest days, and the struggles and strife as it persevered in spreading the faith throughout the ancient world. We celebrate the stories of heroism, contention, miracles, and persecution as a testament to the presence of a Risen Christ in the world, and the actions of the Holy Spirit, operating through the lives of his disciples. This year Eastertide began Easter Sunday on the 31st of March, and it will end with Pentecost Sunday on the 19th of May. This should be considered a time of hope, even when war and violence are all too commonplace, and yet God demonstrates now, as then, that He has not abandoned us. So, use the remaining days to find hope and encouragement through faith.

EUCHARISTIC MIRACLES FAIRE TO VISIT ST. IOSEPH OF THE FOREST

Next weekend, April 27 & 28th, the OLS and St. Joseph of the Forest Faith Formation classes will display their *Eucharistic Miracles Faire* in the Parish Hall after both Masses. There will be a light lunch reception on Sunday. The children have created 20 displays representing Eucharistic miracles from around the world. The impressive event was featured in the February 29th edition of Florida Catholic. You don't want to miss this informative and holy event. The following is an excerpt from Florida Catholic media

"In conjunction with the National Eucharistic Revival, Our Lady of the Springs faith formation classes came together for a Eucharistic Miracle Fair, Feb. 25, 2024. From elaborate to simple, 20 displays illustrated various Eucharistic miracles from around the world.

Faith formation coordinator Deborah Higgins said, "We wanted a way to bring the True Presence to our students." She and Confirmation teacher Heathyr Lamb asked the children and their families to select a miracle that meant something to them. And the families delivered beautiful handwritten displays all the way up to an ornate handmade monstrance. Featured front and center is Blessed Carlo Acutis, a Catholic teenager who died in 2006 but not before telling the world the Eucharist was his 'highway to heaven' and who also made the first website dedicated to Eucharistic miracles. The beautiful illustrations moved hearts. Higgins said one mother told her, "I've been Catholic my whole life, but I don't think I really got it." And a child shared, "Now I know why we are quiet after we receive Jesus. I'm glad Jesus is my friend.""
