

"A Threefold Humility" (Fr Bill)

My Dear Children of God:

In today's Gospel Jesus presents Himself to us as the Good Shepherd. Each of the three Scripture passages today offers us a different image, a different snapshot, in which we discover the true humility required to follow the Good Shepherd, the true humility necessary to live as disciples of Jesus. The three snapshots are pictures of a cripple, a child of God, and a sheep from the flock of the Lord.

Today's first reading speaks of a cripple who was healed by the grace of Christ. We are cripples. Indeed, that is the precise meaning of original sin by which we are spiritually crippled from the moment of conception. We are conceived with the image and likeness of God diminished within us. We are conceived less than God intends, wants, and made us to be. Through the waters of baptism Jesus heals us of this flaw, this brokenness of the sin original. Unfortunately, we then foolishly cripple ourselves by our repeated choices for sin. We are cripples in need of healing.

Our second reading tells us directly that we are God's children – His beloved whom He has chosen to be His daughters and sons. Recall that Jesus said that unless we become like little children, we cannot enter the kingdom of God. He is talking about behavior and attitudes, whereas in today's passage He is talking about 'being' - what we are, not just what we do. We note that we are not like the children of God; we are the children of God in receipt of His amazing love.

In today's Gospel Jesus clearly teaches that we are the sheep of the flock of the Lord. We note that we are not actually sheep, but rather, we are like sheep. So, we are the children of God, but we are like sheep.


Grasping and possessing the joy of Jesus Christ as my Good Shepherd requires the humility to acknowledge that I am crippled by my sins, that I am a child of God, individually chosen and specifically beloved, but a child none the less, and that I am like a sheep in need of a shepherd to provide me even the most basic and essential necessities of life {because I am too dumb to make it on my own}. All three are countercultural, counter to the 'I-did-it-my-way-culture' in which we live. Striving to be a follower whose only leadership is exercised in leading others to join me in following some 'self-proclaimed good shepherd type' is not really what we want for ourselves much less for our children – but this is our vocation (our call) as disciples of Jesus Christ.

It is only in the humility of acknowledging that my own choices for sin have crippled me that I will reach out to renew the healing waters of baptism in the sacrament of reconciliation. It is only in the humility of surrender to being a child of God that I can discover the amazing joy of having the Almighty as my Abba. It is only in the humility of accepting my need for a shepherd to guide and protect me that I will be able, unconditionally and without reservation, to follow Jesus, the Way, the Truth and the Life, i.e. the Good Shepherd.

When I know myself to be a cripple, I am eager to receive the joy of the healing that awaits me. When I know myself to be a child of Abba, the Almighty, I set myself up to discover, over and over again, the joy of my noble heritage in His kingdom. When I know that I am like a sheep, I can accept the joy that comes from the strong protection and sure guidance of the One Who is all-powerful and allknowing.

When I embrace this threefold humility of cripple, child, and sheep I find joy in Jesus, the Good Shepherd Who leads me to the still waters and green pastures of eternal life.
